Coding hepatitis can be a bit challenging. The key is differentiating between the acute and chronic states. Chronic Hepatitis B and C are risk-adjusted diagnoses, Acute Hepatitis and Hepatitis unspecified codes are not.

How does one define chronic? After an initial infection, any persistence of the virus is considered chronic.

Chronic Hepatitis C affects approximately four million Americans. The CDC recommends screening for the following higher risk patients:

IV drug use, transfusion of clotting factors prior to 1987, transfusion of blood or organs prior to 1992, hemodi-alysis, current liver disease, HIV infection, Healthcare workers, and children born to HCV positive mothers.

Chronic Hepatitis B is very common in Southeast Asia, China, and Sub-Saharan Africa. Statistics report that one in 10 persons from South Asia may have Chronic Hepatitis B. Thus screening patients from this area is very important.



### What ICD-9 Do I Use to Code Hepatitis?

- » Chronic Hepatitis-C 070.54
  - Without coma, without mention of delta
    - With coma 0.70.44
- » Chronic Hepatitis-B without coma without delta 070.32
  - With delta 070.33
- » Chronic Hepatitis C
  - With coma 070.44
  - Without coma 070.54

#### What are the non-viral chronic hepatitis codes?

- » Chronic Hepatitis, unspecified 571.40
- » Chronic Persistent Hepatitis 571.41
- » Autoimmune Hepatitis 571.42
- » Alcoholic Hepatitis 571.1

#### **Acceptable Documentation:**

- » 65 year old Vietnamese male with Chronic Hepatitis B with stable liver function test here for follow-up needing additional labs Assessment: No new concerns Plan: Repeat studies and repeat imaging
- » 58 year old with Schizophrenia, IV drug use needing evaluation of Chronic Hepatitis here for follow-up Assessment: Uncertain status

Plan: Repeat labs and follow up in one month

#### **Incomplete Documentation:**

» 65 year old Vietnamese male here for follow-up Assessment: Chronic Plan: Check labs
