

## **Interacting with Patients and Persons Under Investigation**

- <u>Limit How Germs Can Enter Your Facility:</u> Cancel elective procedures, use telemedicine (when available), limit points of entry and visitors to the office.
- <u>Isolate Symptomatic Patients As Soon As Possible:</u> Set up separate, well-ventilated triage areas. Ask patients displaying symptoms about any recent travel, especially to an <u>infected area</u>. Place patients with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 in private rooms with the door closed.
- <u>Protect Healthcare Professionals:</u> Place extra emphasis on proper hand hygiene, install barriers to limit contact with patients at triage, isolate COVID-19 patients and limit the number of staff providing their care. Healthcare professionals interacting with symptomatic patients should follow contact precautions, including wearing masks, eye protection and other protective equipment.
- <u>Safely Monitor and Manage III Patients:</u> When possible, implement alternatives to face-to-face encounters. Manage mildly ill COVID-19 patients at home, if possible.

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
