Subject: Reimbursement of Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) and Mental Health Peer Support for Adults

Effective immediately, the Department is reinstating reimbursement of Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) as a unique bundled service and Mental Health Peer Support for Adults aged twenty-one (21) years or older.

Yesterday the Governor signed [Senate Bill 1446](#) restoring funding for these services following passage by the Idaho Legislature. Funding was restored with a 4% rate reduction in alignment with other Medicaid services for budget holdbacks pursuant to [MA25-17](#) and [MA25-19](#).

Providers may immediately begin working with Magellan, United Healthcare, and Molina to restore services. These managed care contractors will work with providers to reach out to individual members who had been receiving ACT and Peer Support before their elimination.
