Update to Pharmacy Controls

Opioid toxicity and abuse is a public health concern in the United States due to the alarming increase in the number of opioid-related deaths. In 2016, the CDC reported 42,249 overdose deaths involving opioids which is five times higher than in 1999.¹

Benefits of high-dose opioids for chronic pain are not established and at the same time, risks for serious harm related to opioid therapy increases at higher opioid dosages. Dosages of 50-100 morphine milligram equivalents (MME) a day have been found to increase risks for opioid overdose by factors of 1.9 to 4.6 compared to lower doses.²

Effective April 1, 2018, Molina Healthcare of Illinois (Molina) will implement the following Pharmacy control:

Maximum Morphine Equivalent (MME) dosing

For any Member whose daily doses exceed 90mg/day of morphine milligram equivalents (MME), a prior authorization (PA) will be required. This measure does not apply to any Member with cancer or who already is enrolled in hospice or palliative care.
