RE: Project ECHO Nevada- Stimulant Use Disorder Series

Stimulant Use Disorder ECHO Series – launches July 19, 2023, at 12 p.m. PT invites you to their six-session free series entitled <u>Stimulant Use Disorder</u>. Project ECHO Nevada aims to meet primary care providers' needs by offering an alternative to costly travel and long waits for patients who need specialty care.

This six-session ECHO series aims to support healthcare and mental health providers, staff, and administrators with stimulant use disorder patient care. Sessions will be facilitated with a team from Northern Nevada HOPES and will provide a forum to discuss patient cases, address questions/concerns, and collaborate regarding stimulant use disorder therapy.

During each session, participants will have the opportunity to learn from case reviews with an interdisciplinary team of experts and a short didactic presentation. This program's Hub team consists of an interdisciplinary team of experts, including a psychiatrist specializing in addiction, a licensed clinical social worker, board-certified family medicine and addiction physician, a peer support specialist, and an MAT Program Coordinator.

<u>Project ECHO Nevada</u> is pleased to announce that our <u>Stimulant Use Disorder</u> ECHO series will fulfill the new DEA training requirement for providers to maintain their license to prescribe controlled substances. This requirement specifies completing a minimum of 8 hours of training on "safe and controlled substance prescribing" as a condition of receiving or renewing a DEA registration. Each hour-long Stimulant Use



Disorder ECHO series session will meet this requirement and can be collected cumulatively to reach the 8 hours required.

Project ECHO is a telehealth program to amplify the scarce specialty care resources in our state. This is accomplished by holding regularly scheduled video conference sessions where providers can connect with interdisciplinary teams of subject matter experts for case consultation and continuing education.
