Get well, stay healthy

One of the best ways to stay well is by getting annual checkups and regular screenings. This helps your doctor catch problems early when they may be easier to treat. Here is a guide for how often you should get screenings and services, and how soon your doctor should be able to schedule your appointments. If you need help scheduling an appointment, call the number on the back of your member ID card.

Well-baby visits (CHIP)	6 visits within the first 15 months
