
A message from Brian Maddy, Plan President, Molina Healthcare of Wisconsin

Connecting to our communities

Whether it's representing, volunteering, donating, or advocating, the team at Molina Healthcare of Wisconsin never fails to answer the call to serve. Here are some examples of our work so far this year to make a difference in our communities through the delivery of high-quality, government-sponsored care.



In March, we donated and delivered a van full of essential food and hygiene products to the YMCA women's shelter in Madison, WI.



We met with leaders at Food for Health in Milwaukee about opportunities to help ensure equitable access to nutritious food.



Plan President Brian Maddy joined a panel of Wisconsin Medicaid health plan executives in March to discuss ways to enhance services for our state's most vulnerable.



In January, we delivered over 600 gloves, hats, laundry detergent and hygiene products to aid warming centers.



In February, our team rolled up their sleeves and volunteered at the Village Diaper Bank for the WMTV Diaper Drive Match Day.



In April, we were thrilled to be part of Ascension Wisconsin's Annual Blanket of Love Baby Shower to support expectant mothers and families.

Innovative provider partnership improves health for members with diabetes and/or hypertension

In 2023, Molina Healthcare of Wisconsin began a special collaboration with Milwaukee-area ProCare Medical Group to improve health for some of their hardest-to-engage patients with elevated A1C (diabetes) or elevated blood pressure (hypertension). We sought to improve medical adherence by directly engaging members in the care plan and reducing the provider's burden.

As part of this innovative program, we assigned a team to work directly with ProCare office managers and providers to:

- Connect members to appropriate covered services from in-network pharmacy/durable medical equipment (DME) providers;
- Identify members with upcoming appointments and make reminder calls;
- Keep members on task through ongoing care coordination;
- Provide evidence-based education to reinforce provider recommendations;
- Educate front desk staff on the importance of quality;
- Assist with communicating to difficult-to-reach members; and
- Address social determinants of health such as housing, food access and transportation.

As a result, since October 2023, 24 of the 114 identified members have controlled their A1C rates, and 19 have started care management.

Program success story

As part of this program, Molina Transition of Care Coach Becky Vest worked with 47-year old Randy*, who had diabetes since he was a child but who still struggled to keep his A1C in check. Every week, she called to check in on how he was doing. She also visited Randy in his home and joined him at an appointment with his diabetes educator. Becky coordinated all the behind-the-scenes efforts between his ProCare PCP, endocrinologist, diabetes educator, and DME provider.

As a result, this member reduced his A1C in just a few months from 10.1 to a healthy range of 7.1!
