Suggested Timeline for Infants and Children (Birth to 24 Months)

The information below can help your child stay healthy. You and your doctor may decide to do some of these more or less often.

Your child should see his or her doctor for a Well Child Exam at age:	What to expect:

Birth to 2 weeks old	Well Child Exam ¹ Immunizations: Hep B
2 months old	Well Child Exam ¹ Immunizations: DTaP, Hep B, RV, Hib, PCV, IPV
4 months old	Well Child Exam ¹ Immunizations: DTaP, RV, Hib, PCV, IPV
6 months old	Well Child Exam ¹ Immunizations: DTaP, Hep B, RV, Hib, PCV, IPV, Flu ² . The flu shot should be given yearly, starting at 6 months old.
9 months old	Well Child Exam ¹ Blood test
12 to 15 months old	Well Child Exam ¹ (12 and 15 months) Immunizations: MMR, Hib, Varicella (Chicken Pox), PCV, Hep A Anemia Test, Blood Lead Test (12 months) DTap (15 months)
18 months old	Well Child Exam ¹ Immunizations: Hep A
24 months old	Well Child Exam ¹ Blood Lead Test, Flu ² Immunizations for high risk PPSV, Hep A, MCV

- 1. Well Child Exam: Periodic and/or yearly medical exam for children. It includes medical history, physical check up, weight, height, head circumference, and health education. It can include tests or screenings, such as dental, vision and hearing.
- 2. Flu: Yearly for children 6 months to 18 years. Two doses should be given to children less than 9 years old, if they are getting the flu shot for the first time, or if they were given only one dose for the first time during the last flu season.
