

## Healthy checklist – newborn and toddler

### Call your baby's doctor and schedule a first well-baby visit.

The first two years of your baby's life are a crucial time of development. Babies need far more care than adults or older children. That's why regular well-baby visits are so important for your baby's health.

These well-baby visits help you:

- Track your baby's weight and growth
- Ensure your baby is developing normally
- Make sure your baby is eating welland getting enough nutrition
- Know what to expect and prepare for developmental milestones

### Call 911 if you have a medical emergency.



## Take this handy checklist with you to your baby's doctor. This will help make sure your baby gets the right care.
