Healthy Check List – Women

Call your doctor and schedule your yearly well visit.

You go to the doctor when you are sick, but yearly well visits are just as important for your health.

These well visits help you:

- Prevent illness and disease
- Ask questions and talk about concerns
- Talk about medications you are taking

Call 911 if you have a medical emergency.

Take this handy checklist with you to your doctor. This will help make sure you get the care you need.

Doctor visits*

Test or screening	When	Date
Body Mass Index (BMI) with height & weight	Every year	
Blood pressure	Every year	
Vision and hearing	Every year	
Chlamydia	Every year starting at 16 years	
Breast cancer	Every two years starting at age 50	
Blood sugar	Every three years	
Cervical cancers (Pap test)	Every three years for ages 21-64	
Cholesterol	Every five years starting at age 35	
Colorectal cancer (colonoscopy)	Every 10 years starting at age 50	

Vaccines*

Type	When	Date
Flu	Every year	
Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis (Tdap/Tdap)	Every 10 years	
Pneumococcal (pneumonia)	Once at or after age 65	

**Your doctor may suggest different tests, screenings, vaccines or timing based on your specific care needs.*
