A quick list of "do's and don'ts" to help you make the most of your conversations

DOs:

DO wave a hand in the air or gently tap a person's arm to gain their attention

DO look directly at the person and face the light

DO maintain eye contact

DO speak in your regular tone of voice

DO use body language

DO speak directly to the person who is deaf, not the interpreter

DO rephrase your message if the person does not understand you

DO ask about the best way to communicate if you are unsure

DON'Ts:

DON'T ask the interpreter to "tell them..."

DON'T cover your mouth or face

DON'T shout or speak differently than you usually would

DON'T repeat the same words if your message was not understood the first time

DON'T assume an ASL user reads English

DON'T pretend you understand the person if you don't

Final tip - Relax and enjoy your conversation!
