

Important Notice from AHCA: Reinstatement of Service Limits for Community Behavioral Health and Targeted Case Management Services

Effective Date: October 14, 2026

Molina Healthcare of Florida is sharing the following information on behalf of the **Florida Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA)** regarding the reinstatement of service limits for Community Behavioral Health (CBH) and Targeted Case Management (TCM) services for Provider Types **05** and **91**

What This Message Is About

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) went into effect in April 2021 and was designed to support the response to the COVID-19 pandemic. In September 2021, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approved the Agency's ARPA spending plan to increase the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) and support Florida's Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) programs.

CMS required service limits (frequency and duration) for community behavioral health (CBH) and targeted case management (TCM) services to continue to be waived as a condition of continued implementation of the ARPA HCBS Spending Plan. In March 2022, Florida Medicaid issued guidance on waiving service limits for community behavioral health (CBH) and targeted case management (TCM) services for behavioral health providers and Florida Medicaid recipients.

The Agency's ARPA spending has ended, and the Agency received approval from CMS in July 2026 to close the ARPA HCBS Spending Plan.

What Providers Need to Know

- As such, the service limits indicated on the community behavioral health fee schedule and targeted case management fee schedule have been reinstated, **effective October 14, 2026**.
- The reinstatement applies to Community Behavioral Health (CBH) and Targeted Case Management (TCM) services.
- For services provided to managed care plan enrollees, providers must work with each managed care plan to ensure continuity of care for medically necessary courses of treatment as service limits are reinstated.

What Providers Need to Do

- Review the reinstated service limits applicable to Community Behavioral Health (CBH) and Targeted Case Management (TCM) services.
- Ensure services furnished on and after **October 14, 2026**, comply with the applicable service limits.
- For managed care plan enrollees, work with each managed care plan to ensure continuity of care for medically necessary courses of treatment as service limits are reinstated.
