



Guidance for Providers Regarding Possible Lead Exposure in Children Consuming Recalled Cinnamon Applesauce Products

Due to the ongoing investigation of elevated levels of lead linked to the recalled WanaBana USA apple cinnamon puree and applesauce products, Molina Healthcare of Florida recommends providers take action by following guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Food and Drug Administration (FDA):

- Encourage lead screening to parents, caregivers, and guardians of children who may be impacted.
- Educate patients on the health effects of lead exposure.
- Counsel patients and/or their caregivers and guardians not to eat cinnamon-containing apple purée or applesauce products named in the FDA recall announcements.
