

Provider Memorandum

Behavioral Health IATP Claims

Effective August 1, 2018, Molina HealthCare of Illinois (Molina) discontinued the review of Integrated Assessment and Treatment Planning (IATP) claims for Medically Unlikely Edits (MUE), which was identified as a one-unit (15-minute) maximum on IATP services. This change aligns Molina policy with Illinois Medicaid policy and will reduce misunderstanding. Molina Healthcare will automatically adjust affected claims, retroactive to August 1, 2018. **Providers will not be required to resubmit claims.**

About IATP

Integrated Assessment and Treatment Planning (IATP) services include the time spent completing the clinical interview; review of documents; discussions with parents, guardians, or other professionals; and review of information to formulate a diagnosis and service interventions.

IATP services are billed under Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) H2000. Code H2000 is used for comprehensive multidisciplinary evaluation under Other Mental Health and Community Support Services.
