Note: A lower rate indicates better performance.

HOW TO IMPROVE HEDIS SCORES

- ☐ Consider not screening women 16-20 years of age regardless of age at sexual initiation and other behavior-related risk factors.
- ☐ Consider not performing the screening on healthy asymptomatic women.
 - o An "external only" genital examination is acceptable.
- ☐ Discuss the decision whether or not to perform a complete pelvic examination with the patient as this should be a shared decision between the patient and her health care provider.
