Non-Recommended Cervical Cancer Screening in Adolescent Females (NCS)

MEASURE DESCRIPTION

Adolescent females 16-20 years of age should **not** be screened unnecessarily for cervical cancer.

Exclusions: Patient has prior history of cervical cancer, HIV or immunodeficiency disorders.

HOW TO IMPROVE HEDIS SCORES

Consider not screening women 16-20 years of age regardless of age at sexual initiation and other behavior-related risk factors.
Consider not performing the screening on healthy asymptomatic women.
 An "external only" genital examination is acceptable.
Discuss the decision whether or not to perform a complete pelvic examination with the patient as this should be a shared decision between the patient and her health care





provider.
