My patient with prostate cancer is disease free after prostatectomy and I am doing frequent PSA's to monitor. Is it appropriate to code for prostate cancer?

No!

Cancer should only be coded when your patient:

- Is receiving active treatment (surveillance with no evidence of disease does not count)
- 2) Has active disease, treated or not

If neither of the above are true, the most appropriate documentation usually consists of "history of cancer", using a V code.

*The example above is using a specific type of cancer, prostate cancer, but this example is relevant for any type of cancer.

Documentation Examples:

Initial Diagnosis

 50 year old male with new diagnosis of prostate cancer

Assessment: Prostate CA, biopsy positive Gleason 6.

ICD-9 Code: 185ICD-10 Code: C61

Plan: See urologist on Friday

OR

Established Diagnosis

 60 year old male with prostate cancer Assessment: Prostate CA, undergoing radiation

ICD-9 Code: 185ICD-10 Code: C61

Plan: Continue treatment

History of Prostate Cancer

• Codes that identify "history of":

ICD-9 Code: V10.46ICD-10 Code: Z85.46
