- Other muscle disorders

*aka Toxic Myopathy (drugs include statins, steroids, etc.)

Initial Dx. A/P:

 40 year old female with muscle aches all over her body

Assessment: Muscle aches due to Simvastatin

Drug Myopathy

➤ ICD-9 Code: 359.4 Toxic Myopathy

> ICD-10 Codes:

- G72.0 Drug-Induced Myopathy
- *T46.6X5A Antihyperlipidemic drug, initial encounter
- *T46.6X5D Antihyperlipidemic drug, subsequent encounter
- *T46.6X5S Antihyperlipidemic drug, sequela

Plan: Will check CPK

OR

Established Dx.

50 year old male with chronic leg pain
 Assessment: Myalgias better, statin-induced myopathy

> ICD-9 and 10 Codes: See above

Plan: Will continue diet and monitor

*"T46.6x5" is not a valid code and it requires the 7th digit. It may be written as "T46.6x5-".
